

 Would you like to help maintain and beautify our church building, but don't have a lot of time? We've got a job for you!

Here you will find a list of jobs that can be done by one or two individuals relatively quickly. As these jobs are taken on we will add different jobs to the list, so **check** here every week.

- 1. There is a very small pitcher's mound on the baseball field. This needs to be leveled so we can mow.
- 2. The food pantry cabinets in the hallway leading to the Fellowship Hall need to have their locks repaired. The wood the latch hooks to is worn off. It would be a fairly small woodworking project. *Thanks to Johann Friesen for completing this project!*
- 3. Paint the metal stall walls in the ladies restroom and she painted all the metal surfaces and the walls and scrubbed the floor! Judy Phillips completed this project. Thanks Judy!
- 4. Longer term project is to open all the small windows (they tip in). Clean off the frames of the opening and the window. Lube the hinge pivots and the latch pivot points. We want to put some new seals on these windows and this is the prep work necessary. Work when weather permits, can be done in stages.
- 5. The painted artwork in the classrooms B103 and B104 in the lower level needs some attention. We moved some cabinets and the artwork did not extend to the area behind the cabinets. We have the paint. We need an artistic painter to extend the artwork into the unpainted area.
